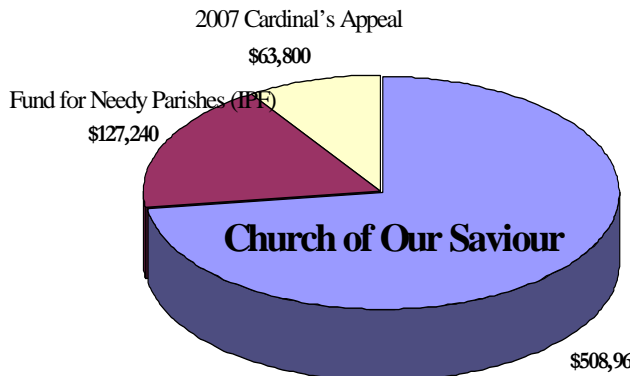




Through Faith We Grow

As we approach the 200th anniversary of this vibrant and diverse community of faith in New York, every parish within this Archdiocese will participate in the Bicentennial Campaign, a vital fundraising effort designed to secure the current and future needs of our parish and other needy parishes within the Archdiocese.

Parishioners of Our Saviour will work together for the good of both our parish and the broader Catholic family. After our 2007 Cardinal's Appeal commitment of \$63,800 is met, funds raised will be divided, with 80% of funds being allocated to our own parish needs and 20% to a dedicated fund helping to benefit needy parishes and schools throughout the Archdiocese.

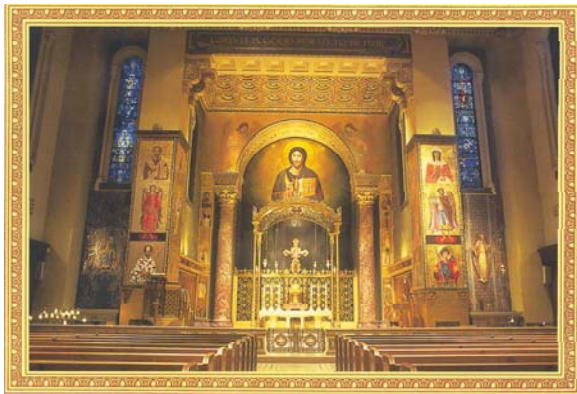

Our Parish History

The Church of Our Saviour serves both the historic Murray Hill residential and business communities surrounding it. Designed in Neo-Romanesque style by noted architect Paul C. Reilly, and built between 1955-1959, it was dedicated on December 25, 1957 and is considered the last of the great ornamented stone churches in America.

Land limitations dictated a ten story building, four below ground and six above.

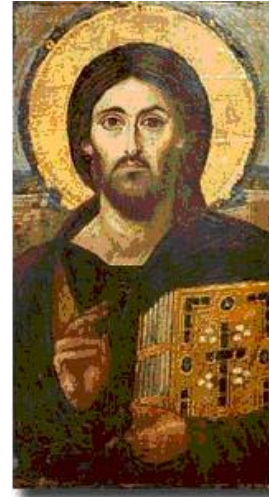


The great main oak doors of the Roman Catholic church, situated on the corner of Park Avenue and 38th Street, open to reveal master art works, which complement the external stone statuary bearing Christian witness to the throngs of people who visit and pass by every day.

The ultimate witness is, however, not the building itself but the people who bring it to life. "Glory to God whose power working in us can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine.

Our Parish Today

After many changes to the surrounding Murray Hill area, The Church of Our Saviour continues to feed the spiritual needs of the community. Parishioners come from all over the Archdiocese to attend weekday and weekend services in the beautiful surrounding that is our church.



Operating with no endowment, Our Saviour has been able to bring itself from financial difficulty to financial solvency within a few short years, thanks to the careful oversight of the pastor and the Trustees.

With more than 100 children in our religious education program, more than 20 per year in RCIA, baptisms numbering more than 80, and more than 40 couples celebrating the sacrament of marriage this year, Our Saviour has emerged as a strong, vibrant, and viable parish.

In order to continue to our mission, and in anticipation of the 50th anniversary of the dedication of Our Saviour, we have embarked on the Bicentennial Parish Campaign. We hope to address many projects still in need of attention.

Looking to the Future Needs and Projected Costs

We have identified a number of projects that can help make Our Saviour an efficient and prayerful place to gather, worship and celebrate. Going forward, we must continue to meet the many needs of our parishioners who live and work in our neighborhoods.

We hope that, through these physical improvements, we become better suited to fulfill our Christian mission of service and outreach. Listed below are some of the important projects we look to address:

- Remodeling of Rectory, Reception, Offices and Public Rest Room
- Completion of the Information Technology and Computer Systems Project
- Installation of Modern Security, Public Address and Electronic Bell Tower Systems
- Furniture, Fixtures, Lighting and Teaching Aids for the Children's CCD Program
- Replacement/Upgrades to the Interior Plumbing, Mechanical, Electrical and HVAC Equipment
- Renovation of McMahon Hall to include Lighting, a Commercial Quality Serving Kitchen and Rest Rooms
- Installation of Modern electronic "Controls and Machinery" for the Elevator
- Renovation of Church Grounds, Entrances & Lighting and Renovation of the Front Garden
